 - Recommendation: include/charge certification fee up front, so certification review can begin upon payment.
 - e. Automation/simplification of DERM Holds/Releases on Water Control, Tree and Sewer holds
 - i. Now, DERM holds placed on building permits, but Building Dept. not told that permits were obtained and hold can be released.
 - ii. Applicant must call Building Dept. and advise that permits were issued and to remove Hold status.
 - iii. **Recommendation:** IT assistance needed to release Hold designations immediately upon DERM permit issuance.
 - iv. **Recommendation:** release individual units as sold, under Master permit hold bond until all structures cleaned.
